NOTICE TO CONTRIBUTORS

Social Justice welcomes contributions to all sections of the journal. Publishing decisions are made by the Editorial Board based on recommendations by the Editorial Advisory Board and other reviewers. We are committed to working with authors, and we respond with comments whether or not we publish the submission.

Please send us *three* printed copies, and keep one since we cannot return materials. All text, including quotations and bibliographic references, should be double spaced. Because *Social Justice* has a computerized production process, we request that you also send submissions on 3¹/₂-inch floppy diskettes. (Mac users can also send their 3¹/₂-inch disks.) Provide two disks, each clearly labeled with the model of your computer, the operating system, and the word processing software used.

If you are submitting typewritten manuscript copy only, please send the original manuscript and use Courier, Prestige, or Gothic typeface if possible; double space lines and leave 1¹/₂-inch margins on the top, bottom, right, and left.

For bibliographic references, we request the following format:

- All references to books, monographs, articles, and statistical sources should be specified in the main text (and in the text of footnotes) by last name of author, year of publication, and pagination where appropriate (e.g., Johnson, 1973: 15–16). The complete citation should be listed at the conclusion of the article under “REFERENCES.” Such citation should be alphabetical by name of author; for authors cited more than once, by years of publication, with most recent references first:

Platt, Tony and Paul Takagi

1980 Punishment and Penal Discipline. San Francisco: Crime and Social Justice Associates.

- Use footnotes only for substantive comments, not for citation. Do not use *ibid.*, *op cit.*, *loc. cit.*, etc. Place them in a “NOTES” section.

- Type each table on a separate page. In the text, make reference to the table or chart by noting “See Table 1 at the end of the article,” etc. Place all tables at the end of computer files. Clarification of mathematical notation and symbols should be made when desirable.

- Please send a brief biographical sketch including your complete mailing address.
