The complete citation should be listed at the conclusion of the article under “REFERENCES.” Such citation should be alphabetical by name of author; for authors cited more than once, by years of publication, with most recent references first. Use the letters a, b, c, etc., to distinguish citations of different works by the same author in the same year, e.g., Foucault (1975a, 1975b). Italicize the titles of books and periodicals, and place article titles within quotation marks. For bibliographic references, we request the following format for books and articles:
